1st 2004 container - All boxes have been collected except two - please advise Justine at ECWA 4 May 2004

Afrinspire has equipped resource centres and schools with computers, vocational tools and books. To date over two hundred computers have been placed. Two complete Law Libraries have been sent to Uganda where only one existed in the country before.
